Bronwyn Hack

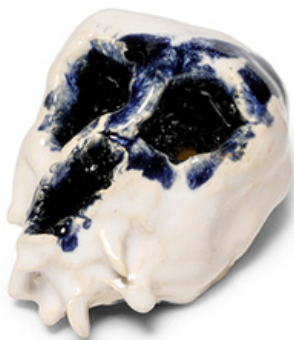


- Bronwyn Hack was born in Melbourne in 1979.

Julian Martin



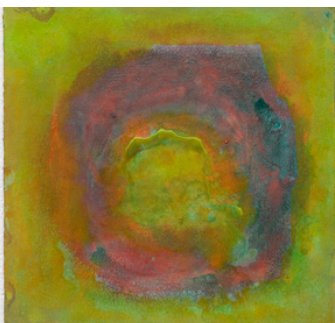
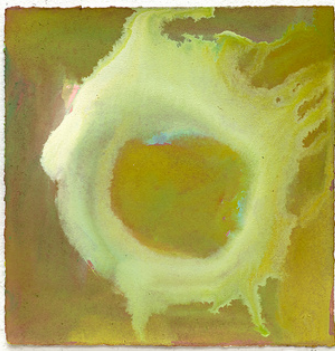
- Julian Martin was born in Melbourne in 1969.

Fulli Andrinopoulos



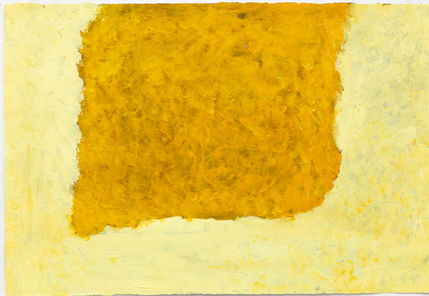
- Fulli Andrinopoulos was born in Melbourne in 1965.

- Recently Fulli has been using fabric and thread to create circles.
- Fulli draws a circle in all of her artwork. Each one is different because of the marks around the circles she makes with a paintbrush.

Ian Gold



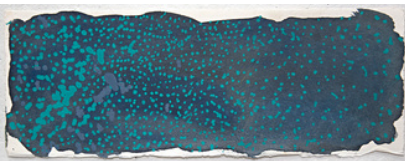
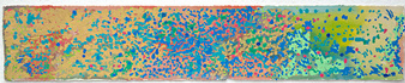
- Ian Gold was born in Melbourne in 1988.

- Salome uses paint, pastel, pencil, ink and markers to make her drawings and paintings.

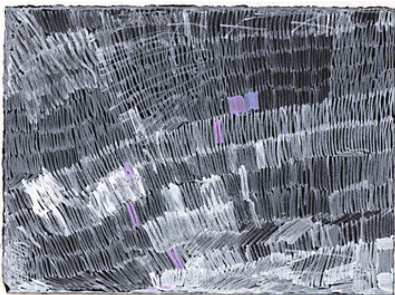
- The images on the left are some of Salome's ceramics in the show.

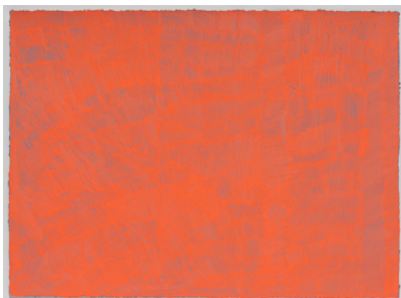
Wendy Dawson
