# Bobby KYRIAKOPOULOS

Bobby Kyriakopoulos' practice focuses primarily on painting and drawing, with a meticulous and deliberate application of watercolour and gouache.

Depicting nostalgic scenes of film stills and street corners, as well as tender, quirky portraits, his highly gestural work seems to catch the subject matter in movement at an exact moment. The interplay of positive and negative space in Kyriakopoulos' work is effortless; balanced yet comfortably unbalanced, drawing the eye naturally toward an often intriguing narrative.

Kyriakopoulos (b 1990) has worked at the Arts Project Australia studio since 2011. He has been curated into numerous group exhibitions including 'Spring 1883', The Establishment, Sydney; 'POP! Reflections on Popular Culture', Wangaratta Art Gallery, Wangaratta; 'Well Red', Robin Gibson Gallery, Sydney; 'Melbourne Now', NGV International, Melbourne; and 'Small Works 2014 Art Prize', Brunswick Street Gallery, Fitzroy. His work is held in private collections Australia-wide.


### Leo CUSSEN

The work of Leo Cussen draws inspiration from Hollywood's glamour era. His pastel works are characterised by repetition, text, movement and a sense of humour.

The work has an intensity which is evident by the energetic application of his chosen medium. Cussen used repetition to embody the larger-than-life spirit of Hollywood, from a time when screen legends like Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers reigned supreme. His fascination with the entertainment industry extended to the character of Dr Who, and Cussen produced an extensive series of works based on this theme. Within the context of his art-making, Cussen's obsessions were a positive creative force.

Cussen (b 1959, d 2015) was an established artist who worked in the Arts Project Australia studio for over twenty years. His retrospective exhibition 'Leo Cussen: Golden Years', was held at Arts Project Australia in 2017. Throughout his career, he was featured in numerous national and international exhibitions including the Marie Ellis OAM Drawing Prize, Brisbane; Melbourne Art Fair, Melbourne; Pearls of Arts Project Australia, Stuart Purves Collection, National Touring Exhibition; Exhibition #4, Museum of Everything, London; Australian Outsiders, Fischer Gallery, San Francisco; and Outsider Art Fair, hosted by Phyllis Kind Gallery, New York. His work is held in the National Gallery of Australia, Canberra; National Gallery of Victoria (gift of Stuart Purves AM), Melbourne; as well as private collections worldwide.




## Dionne CANZANO

Highly skilled with dry pastel, Dionne Canzano's works consist of veils of blended colour and detailed pastel pencil line work. Although the works possesses a soft, dream-like quality, there is also wildness to the imagery.

Thematically, Canzano focuses on subjects close to her heart, including Elvis Presley, the Collingwood Magpies and various animals.

## Anthony ROMAGNANO

#### Anthony Romagnano works predominantly in pencil, paint and digital media, often referencing source material from popular culture or old fairytale illustrations.

He meticulously examines and interprets an image before drawing in the outline of an image, then adding blocks of vivid colour. In combination, his compositions present much like a mosaic or stained glass window, except that they are applied in opaque layers of pencil, paint or digital rendering.

Romagnano (b 1985) has worked in the Arts Project Australia studio since 2004, and had his first solo exhibition at Arts Project Australia in 2008. He has exhibited in numerous group shows including; The World Around Us, Arts Project Australia, Melbourne, 2019; Petite Pop!, Sofitel Melbourne on Collins, Melbourne, 2019; Wyndham Art Prize Exhibition, Wyndham Art Gallery, Werribee, 2018; CCP Salon, Centre for Contemporary Photography, Melbourne; Spring1883, The Establishment, Sydney, 2017; Signature Style, Arts Project Australia, Melbourne, 2016; Small Universe, No Vacancy Gallery, Melbourne, 2014; and Melbourne Art Fair, Royal Exhibition Building, Melbourne. ### Paul HODGES

Paul Hodges is a mid-career artist whose prefered medium is painting. Inspired by images of dancers, models and the romantic Old Masters, his work concentrates on representing the human figure.

Hodges reinterprets found imagery from magazines and books, using ink and gouache to experiment with colour and form. Similar to his paintings, Hodges' ceramic works are often figurative, fluid and gentle in their composure.

Hodges (b 1974) has been a regular studio artist at Arts Project Australia since 1998, and held a solo exhibition at Arts Project Australia in 2015. He has been included in numerous group exhibitions including, Outsider Art Fair, DUTTON Gallery, New York; Spring 1883, Sydney; Melbourne Art Fair, Royal Exhibition Building, Melbourne (each year from 2004-2014); National Gallery of Victoria 150th Anniversary, NGV, Melbourne; and Pearls of Arts Project Australia: The Stuart Purves Collection, National touring exhibition (2007-2009). His work is held in the National Gallery of Victoria (as gifted by Stuart Purves) and in private collections Australia-wide.

## Cathy STAUGHTON

A prolific and accomplished artist, Cathy Staughton's distinctive personal style speaks volumes through her clear, quick and direct way of working; her paintings and drawings acting as a barometer for her happiness, sadness, dreams and desires.

Symbolic characters such as robots and saintly figures embellished with Staughton's vivid and idiosyncratic imagination appear time and again, often reflecting a distinct good-bad dichotomy. Staughton also maintains a life-long fascination with Luna Park due to family connections and endless childhood memories. Overtones of humour, pathos and nostalgia endow Staughton's work with gravitas. The compelling and often poignant capturing of moments render the alternate reality created by Staughton magnetic.

Staughton (b 1968) has worked in the Arts Project Australia studio since 1989. She has had four solo exhibitions at Arts Project, including 'Cathy Staughton's Wondrous Imaginarium', 2013; 'Cathy Staughton Solo', 2010; 'Good Dream – Bad Dream', 2000; and 'Danse Macabre', 1998, as well as held a solo exhibition at MADMusée in Belgium in 2002. She has also exhibited in numerous group exhibitions including 'Melbourne Art Fair', Melbourne; 'Renegades: Outsider Art', KickArts Contemporary Arts, Cairns; and 'Exhibition #4', Museum of Everything, London. Her work is held in the MADMusée's collection and private collections worldwide.

Working in pencil and colour fibre-tipped pen, Boris Cipusev utilises text as core visual material to create vibrant, colourful drawings.

Through his methodically constructed, crisp, balanced textbased works, he transforms the 'noise' of his environment into idiosyncratic, quirky and playful imagery, pushing the words forward with gentle individualism.

Peter Ben is a multi-disciplinary artists, who works across a range of media from animation, to ceramics, collage and painting. Themes he explores in his work are drawn from his rich imagination, which is influenced by science fiction, as well as his avid interest in music and popular culture. Ben has a wry sense of humour, which is expressed in his richly layered work.

Ben (b 1972) has been a regular studio artist at Arts Project Australia since 1996, and presented his first solo exhibition at Arts Project Australia in 2013. # Lisa REID

Lisa Reid is an accomplished multimedia artist working in ceramics, painting, drawing, printmaking and digital media. Often utilising preliminary workings of an image as a blueprint for her work, her attention to detail and focus is apparent not only in her painting and drawing but also her ceramic practice.

Her dedication is reflected in her highly detailed, intricate work and meticulous practice, inspired by working from life, old family snaps and popular culture images. Reid's work reflects a rich and unique view of everyday life, where the artist's interpretation and translation of imagery are keenly observed.

Reid (b 1975) has worked as an artist in the Arts Project Australia studio since 2002 and held her first solo exhibition 'Lisa Reid: The Devil's in the Detail' at Arts Project Australia in 2015. She has exhibited in numerous group shows, including 'Painting. 
