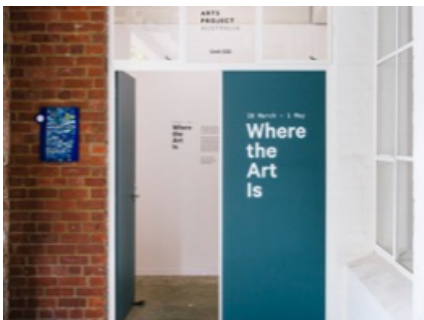
Exhibition information

- Amani makes his drawings using pen, watercolour and markers.
- Amani makes art about the people and places in his life. Sometimes Amani is inspired by other artists and musicians.

Featured artists

Atong Atem



- Atong Atem is a South Sudanese artist who was born in Ethiopia.
- Atong makes photographs and videos.
- Atong makes art about her culture.
- Atong's photos are portraits. This means that they are photos of people.
- Atong's portraits tell stories about the the people in the photos.
- The image on the left is Atong's photo in the show.
- This photo is called Banksia. Banksia is about the stories of people who had to move from their home country to another.

Featured artists

Susie Buykx



- Susie uses pottery to make objects. Pottery is the process of using clay that is hardened with heat to make an object like a plate or a bowl.
- Susie is inspired by the colours and lines she sees in the bush land of the country of north east Victoria.



- For Susie home is where she feels loved, secure, warm and at peace. This could be when she is sitting around a campfire with friends after a wonderful day bushwalking, spending time with her family, or peacefully at home alone by the fire in the evening.

Featured artists

Cooper+Spowart



- Cooper+Spowart is a collaboration between two artists named Victoria Cooper and Doug Spowart.
- Victoria makes photographs.
- Doug makes photobooks.
- For Victoria and Doug home is two things. Home is being in a place that is comfortable and safe with a garden to rest in. Home is also a place where you can keep your memories.
- The image on the left is of a photobook by Victoria and Doug's in the show.

Featured artists

Erub Arts Torres Strait and Ghost Net Collective



- Erub Arts is made up of four different groups of artists from Erub.
- Erub is one of the Torres Strait Islands where approximately 400 people live.
- The people who live there are known as Erubam le or Erub people.



- Erub artists make art about their culture. They are inspired by their land, the sea and their family relationships.
- Ghost Net Collective are a group of artists who started making art together in 2010.



- Ghost Net Collective make art using recycled fishing nets.
- The images on the left are of the artwork in this show that Erub Arts Torres Strait and Ghost Net Collective made together.

Aishah Kenton



- Aishah Kenton was born in Singapore in 1998.
- Aishah makes photographs.
- Aishah makes photographs about her life experiences.
- The photographs Aishah made for this show are about Aishah's family history and herself.

Ron McBurnie



- Ron McBurnie has been making art in Townsville since 1980.
- Ron makes prints and paintings.
- Ron is inspired by history, new art and the things he observes in his everyday life.
